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Programs and Services

Patient Education Programs

Conferences & Meetings - NENHF offers travel grants for families to attend the Bleeding Disorders Conference annually.

<u>Family Education Weekend</u> – A weekend of education that focuses on educational & networking opportunities. National speakers and experts in the field of bleeding disorders are brought in with breakout tracks for multiple subgroups.

<u>Parent Information & Networking Group (PING)</u> - Held twice yearly, PING brings together newly diagnosed or newly identified families and parents with children who have a bleeding disorder.

<u>Industry Partner Dinners</u> – educational dinner seminars in partnership with several Hemophilia Treatment Manufacturers & Home Health Care Infusion Companies.

Advocacy Outreach State & Federal

<u>Nebraska State Advocacy Day</u> – Held yearly, this program brings families to their local state legislator to discuss bleeding disorders and the legislation that may be impacting them.

<u>Washington Days</u> – A three day conference in Washington, DC where a contingent of Nebraska Families meet with their elected officials and educate them on bleeding disorders and encourage them to support legislation that directly impacts them.

Bleeding Disorder Children and Family Camp Opportunities

<u>Family Camp</u> – This weekend camping experience is for families and provides an opportunity to build bonds in a camp setting and challenge expectations on adventuring with a bleeding disorder.

<u>Bleeding Disorder Camp</u>- Full week kid's camp is available in partnership with Midwest Hemophilia Association, transport is provided.

<u>Big Red Factor Newsletter</u> – Our digital newsletter contains current research, hemophilia treatment updates, and upcoming Programs.

Financial Assistance Program

This fund is set up to help families who are in need of emergency financial assistance to cover such things as rent, utilities, insurance, copays, and medical expenses.

<u>Harvest Festival</u> – Held annually at Roca Pumpkin Patch, families come together for lunch & networking and then are able to go and enjoy a wonderful day at the Pumpkin Patch.
